Exercise 1: Community Vision

The intent of the exercise is to expand the Community Vision as narratives and stories with specific language to better describe Faribault's character and attributes.

You will have 15 minutes to identify unique elements, differentiators, stories, or "things" that make Faribault different from surrounding towns.

Examples:

- Name a unique or specific Historic characteristic of Faribault that sets it apart or cannot find in other towns
- Share a story about growing up in Faribault

Exercise 2: Community Values

The intent of this exercise is to integrate the Vision 2040 Community Values into the Journey to 2040 Plan as a preliminary set of Guiding Principles in order to shape a cohesive planning effort.

You will have 15 minutes to share what things you would like to see integrated on each of the Community Values.

Example:

Innovation: What innovative ideas do you see being applied to any of the three Planning Efforts?

- You can write down comments on a post it note to explain their reasoning
- If you feel strongly about relaying more than one answer, then please fill out a comment card
- There will be a blank statement area for the group to express a particular statement(s) that was not covered.
