













Preliminary Design Principles

Q2: When thinking about the future of parks in Faribault, which of the following park facilities do you think should go in 50% of the parks? Pick up to five facilities.











Theme: Opportunities for Growth & Change

- Planning for this system, or **Theme**, means:
 - Understanding Faribault's 'sweet spot' in business where does it excel?
 What other systems are needed to support it's continued success?
 - Asking difficult questions about trade-offs, nothing is unlimited
 - Understanding where gaps exist in the City's housing, infrastructure, services and what needs to change
 - Identifying areas of opportunities, and making decisions that support the city's ability to capitalize

Theme: Living & Dwelling

- Planning for this system, or Theme means:
 - Guiding appropriate acreages, in appropriate locations to match housing needs
 - Consideration of how current and future residents want to 'use' their homes –
 such as multi-generational households, home-based businesses, places of
 gathering, activity, etc.
 - Understanding WHO might move here and matching their housing needs with permitted housing types
 - Creating high-quality neighborhoods of all types (SF & MF) that are walkable, accessible and connected to amenities

Theme: Land Use & Neighborhood Pattern

- Planning for this system, or **Theme** means:
 - Evaluating how to create a 'balanced' land use plan that encourages diversity and leads to a sustainable community
 - Understanding relationship of guiding appropriate and adequate land uses in appropriate locations that support the City's objectives
 - Encouraging diversity in available land uses so that targeted areas are developed to their highest-and-best use

Theme: Connections – Nature & Health

- Planning for this system, or Theme means:
 - Evaluating accessibility to parks, trails and open space for the enjoyment of all residents
 - Establishing level of commitment to the system and using it as character defining system
 - Deciding how system is integrated into every day decisions for residents, stakeholders and business (i.e. is it important to have access to park amenities on lunch breaks to encourage activity?)

Theme: Resilient Systems


- Planning for this system, or Theme means:

 - Evaluating alternatives if we can do better, why not do better?






PROPOSED OPEN SPACE
